

# Tips for a Successful Presentation

## ILAS 2008, Cancún

The Local Organizing Committee would like to respectfully offer the following points for a successful presentation of your talk at ILAS 2008.

- There will be a laptop with a projector for your presentation. Make sure you bring your presentation on a CD or a USB flash memory. The laptops have no floppy drive and no internet connection.
- The laptops will contain Microsoft Power Point and Adobe Acrobat Reader. Make sure your presentation runs with one of these softwares. A PDF presentation generated using  $\text{\LaTeX}$  with the BEAMER class seems to be the popular choice these days! Other useful  $\text{\LaTeX}$  packages are *foiltex* and *seminar*.
- There will be no overhead projectors nor whiteboards/blackboards available.
- Please make sure that the font size is adequate for a large room. Any size larger than 24pt should be adequate. Also, make sure that the pages appear on a *landscape* orientation.
- Audiences do not appreciate computer presentations that consist of pages of a paper, published or to be published. Please avoid doing this.
- The pages of your presentation should not be overcrowded with lines. About 10 lines per page is usually adequate. Try not to put more than 15 lines!!
- Try to keep your presentation short. A good rule of thumb is: a bit less than one page per minute of presentation, although this varies with each case. Practice your presentation to see how long it takes.
- If you must include proofs, try to make them as short and intelligible as you can.
- Avoid long calculations. All calculations included should be kept short enough to fit in the time allotted for that page.
- Remember that you have been an audience member. Try to avoid doing those things that have bothered you when you have listened to a talk.
- Above all, make your experience giving a talk a pleasant one. Have fun in Cancún!
